I have been teaching in the same building for 21 years. My allergies start the moment I walk into the building and end the moment I walk out.

Over the years, my room has flooded several times from roof issues. Mold grows behind the ceiling tiles, there are huge brown spots on the ceiling. Instead of addressing the mold, new ceiling tiles are put up, so no one can see where the issues are. The vent in my classroom is covered in dust; the children sneeze constantly while in the building.
