I am able to meet the needs of english language learners, special education students, struggling students and even challenging higher students to give them what they all need to access and grow with the curriculum. I have deeper connections with students and their families which has resulted in tremendous growth both academically, socially, and emotionally for all students. The impacts of Covid continue to impact my students and will for some time. Smaller classes allow for remediation, individualized instruction and small group work. Please know that the smaller the classes the more all students can grow. Students are also coming to school with more instances of trauma and neglect so my time with them is critical. Please for the future of our students co wider capping the class sizes.
